In November, our weekly tips aim to inspire and equip travelling dads. This week, we're focusing on being a role model for your children. Your children take in everything they see and hear. Think about the example you are setting for your kids - they will model their inter-personal relationships on how they see others behave.

- When returning home after time away, be aware of adjusting back into the family dynamic.
- Be conscious of how you talk about and treat others, including the comments you make about others when they're not there - and even the way you demonstrate friendship.
- In stressful situations, express your emotion respectfully and always apologise if you slip up - try to avoid making an excuse, and own your behaviour.
- Try to maintain a can-do attitude. If your kids are exposed to positive, motivated people they are more likely to adopt this attitude in their own lives.

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


