This week we had our first ever Aboriginal Kindergarten Orientation Day. We are so excited to be welcoming new Aboriginal students to Mirida next year. Aboriginal students starting Kindergarten next year had the opportunity to meet Chae Moloney, Milton Public School's Aboriginal Education Officer, as well as teachers Mrs Brooke Knight, Mrs Lisa Patterson and Mrs Naomi Rafidi. Students arrived and Year Five Aboriginal Prefect Nominees Lakeisha and Mahlie started us off with Acknowledgement of Country. We painted hands to make Aboriginal flag handprint library bags. Next, we dot painted giriwa (goannas) and boomerangs. We went for a tour of the school. We visited the Aboriginal art murals and ended up in the Infants playground. The kids had a fantastic time and it was wonderful spending time with some of our Aboriginal families.



UHS Boys Didge Group visits Mirida

On Wednesday the 27th of December, Ulladulla High School Boys Didge Group ran a Didge workshop with our Year Three to Six Aboriginal boys. The UHS boys introduced themselves and taught our boys the high school Koori handshake. It was great to see the kids connect and build relationships with older role models. They showed us how it is easier to use PVC pipe as a didgeridoo beginner. Kids explored different techniques for how to breathe and make a consistent sound. In the end we had a collaborative group session playing along with the UHS boys as they added amazing animal sounds.



Aboriginal Picture Book

Adam Gowen from the University of Wollongong and Mrs Rafidi proudly presented Milton PS with copies of the book 'Coomer Nulunga Cultural Trail' which was illustrated by some of our talented year 4 students after their excursion to the Ulladulla Aboriginal trail. The book was written by locals Michelle McBride and Leanne Brook who then collaborated with MPS and UPS year 4 students, the Local Lands Council and the University of Wollongong to publish this exception story. 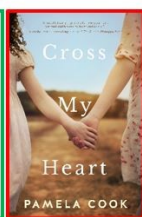

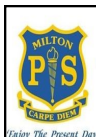
