- Small pieces of fruit, yoghurt or snack items in a reusable container
- Whole fruits without packaging



Avoid ...

- Sandwich packed in plastic bags glad wrap, foil or paper
- Disposable drink boxes, pouches, cans, cartons, and bottles
- Disposable forks and spoons
- Pre-packaged single-serve snack items
- Yoghurt in squeeze pouches

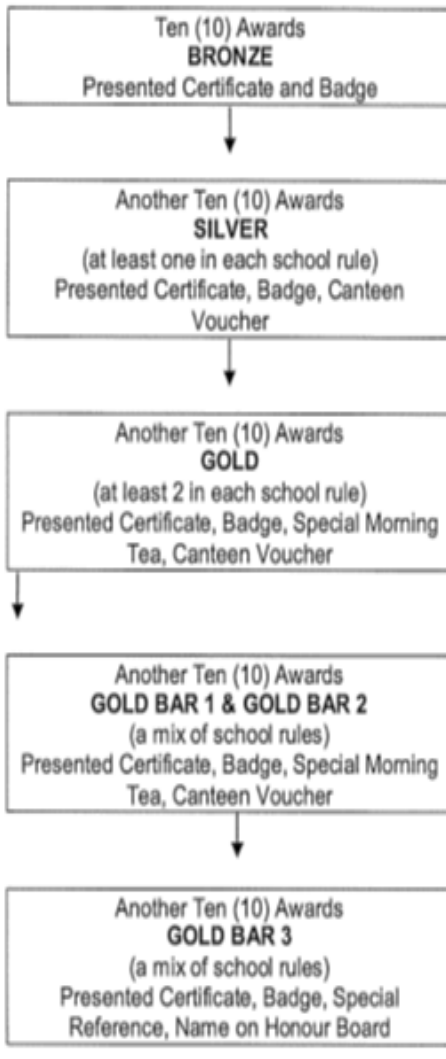
Pedestrian Safety

SCHOOL ZONE Offences – As at 22 January 2016

To avoid receiving a fine when you're dropping off or picking up children from school please observe the road rules associated with signs around schools. These are a guide only and are subject to change without notice.

	SPEEDING OFFENCES There has been an increase to the monetary fine applicable to Speeding Offences in School Zones.	Maximum Penalty \$3740 + 7 Demerit Points
	MOBILE PHONE USE You must not drive while using a hand-held mobile phone in a school zone.	Penalty \$425 + 4 Demerit Points
	CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS Disobey hand-held stop sign at Children's Crossing or approach Children's Crossing too quickly to stop safely.	Penalty \$519 + 4 Demerit Points
	U TURNS Make a U-Turn without giving way to pedestrian or vehicle in a School Zone.	Penalty \$531 + 4 Demerit Points
	NO STOPPING Under no circumstances are you allowed to stop here (unless there is a medical or other emergency).	Maximum Penalty \$319 + 2 Demerit Points
	NO PARKING You may stop here for no more than 2 minutes, but only when engaged in picking up or dropping off passengers and you must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Otherwise no stopping is permitted.	Penalty \$177 + 2 Demerit Points
	BUS ZONE You are not allowed to stop your vehicle unless you are driving a bus.	Penalty \$319 + 2 Demerit Points
	DOUBLE PARKING You are not permitted to stop or park your vehicle alongside another vehicle that is already parked parallel to the kerb.	Penalty \$319 + 2 Demerit Points

Weekly Tip: Helping your kids feel special.

In November, our weekly tips aim to inspire and equip travelling dads.

Technology gives you the ability to keep in touch, even when you're miles apart. Daily chats over the phone or face-time allow kids to hear your voice (and even see your face). These catch-ups allow you and your kids to maintain a connectedness.

This is one simple way you can still 'be there' for your kids, for them to share their stories, thoughts or concerns, even when you're away.

Stay connected

- Call your kids every day where possible. Ask them questions about their day and tell them about yours. Let them know that you love them and miss them.
- Don't limit communication to a phone - video calls are fun and easy ways to keep in touch, especially with young kids.
- Send your kids text messages during the day if possible, let them know what you are doing and ask them how they are going (especially if they are dealing with a particular challenge or special occasion, like an exam or a competition).

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
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
